PRESIDENT'S UPDATE

Dear Friends, this has been a year of change and opportunity for the CPPF. Our first and only President and our Land Chair both retired. Joan Rohan and Donna Peterson spearheaded our mission to acquire, restore, manage and preserve Chiwaukee Prairie for the past 22 years. Trying to fill their gargantuan shoes has helped us appreciate just how much they did for this organization. Also, Steve Richter, The Nature Conservancy Land Manager for the last 17 years, will be leaving Chiwaukee for a new assignment. We wish him much success and offer our great thanks for all his work for our prairie.

More change came with the fortunate addition of two long time prairie lovers. Kay McClelland, a naturalist, joined our Board of Directors and has begun updating the plant inventory and leading hikes. Lori Artiomow, a biologist, has extended the Chicago Wilderness <u>Plants of Concern</u> program to Chiwaukee with the help of a grant from the Citizen-Based Monitoring Partnership Program. Training will be offered at UW-Parkside in May for new monitors. Because monitoring for changes over time is a critical part of management, we are delighted to have this program at Chiwaukee.

Happenings on the prairie: The November 9th controlled burn guarantees a fabulous show of Shooting Stars in May! With stewardship grants from WDNR, we are working with Cedarburg Science to control a variety of invasive plants. Workday volunteers continue to do invaluable restoration work every month. Field classes from UW-Parkside return. Plants of Concern monitoring has begun. A variety of research is taking place; small mammal inventory, raptor migration study, Blanding's Turtle monitoring, groundwater level recordings, milkweed pollinator study, and more. Next year will bring new signage for Chiwaukee, our first annual bird blitz, the biennial Big Hike, and our usual breakfast and picnic for volunteers and supporters.

We continue to pursue opportunities to further our mission by working cooperatively with other organizations, especially TNC and WDNR. Others include UW-Parkside, Chicago Wilderness, Boy Scouts, local government, and other state and local conservation organizations. Also, we give educational presentations to interested groups and in March, it will be to our long time supporter, the Four Seasons Garden Club.

On the all important topic of land acquisition, north of 116th Street, WDNR was able to purchase three lots in 2006 and has another six lots in process currently. Of the original lots south of 116th street, 73, or less than 15%, remain in private ownership with 44 different owners. All have been contacted recently resulting in several interested responses. We will pursue opening dialogues with more owners and are optimistic that continued discussions will lead to acquisitions in 2008.

Finally, 2007 also marked the loss of two women, Karla Krampert and Althea Brach, who were among the first friends of the prairie in 1964, and who continued their support throughout their lives. As CPPF moves into the 23rd year of its mission, we thank the many of you who have been with us for most or all of those years and our many newer Friends. A special thanks to our very dedicated Board of Directors who continue to give so generously of their time and resources, and to our corps of restoration volunteers. We strive now to honor the efforts of all who have worked for and supported the prairie over the years. Their goals are our goals and with your support, together we are saving a prairie.



They prefer prairies with tall and intermediate grasses and dine on insects, plants, seeds, fruit, bird eggs, and carrion. Living in burrows that are deep and well drained, they hibernate from about September through April. Amazingly, sightings have been reported at Chiwaukee Prairie for the last three summers. If you spot one, let us know!
