Ramsar Convention

Dear Friends,

This September, the 15 miles of coastal ecosystem from Kenosha to Waukegan received the designation as "**Wetlands Of International Importance**" in recognition of its globally rare community types, its 930 native plant species and its 300 animal species as well as meeting other criteria. The designation publicly validates our 50 years of volunteer efforts to save and restore Chiwaukee Prairie, an ecological jewel in the Lake Plain. We gladly continue organizing those volunteer efforts.

Now, it is time again to review the past year and share plans for 2016 as we renew *our mission: to acquire, restore, manage and preserve Chiwaukee Prairie and support research and environmental education.*

Land Acquisition: Earlier this year, the transfer of lands to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) from The Nature Conservancy (TNC) was finalized. DNR now owns and manages the Chiwaukee Prairie State Natural Area from the dunes to the state line. The delay in DNR receiving the land from TNC and DNR budget timing have slowed negotiations with interested owners but this will pick up in 2016. In our planning meeting with DNR staff we were able to set priorities and coordinate our future acquisition efforts. Also, we are continuing to follow up on several tax delinquent lots which are moving slowly through the Kenosha County process and, ultimately, unredeemed lots will transfer to DNR.

Inside the Chiwaukee Prairie boundary from the Kenosha dunes to the Illinois state line there remain nearly 100 privately owned lots to be acquired.

The need for your donations continues!

Restoration & Management: The shift to volunteering with DNR from working with TNC meant several changes; applying as lead volunteers, passing herbicide exams, and recording all work and hours on a DNR database. Tracking volunteer hours is critical for grant in-kind matching. We have also enjoyed the availability of DNR staff on site for guidance and assistance. While grant supported contractors continued treating buckthorn sprouts and herbiciding a list of invasive forbs, volunteers

have and will continue working on those invasives not on the list, and there are many! This year Discretionary funds were used to repair and fuel our brush mowers and provide volunteers with a portable toilet rental.

The long awaited "big burn" finally took place on April 23rd and covered one fourth of the Prairie south of 116th Street. It did indeed produce a carpet of shooting stars in May! Surprisingly, it also produced an unexpected number of Eastern Prairie White Fringed Orchids, which are federally endangered. We are hopeful that more burns will follow next spring and are mowing firebreaks like crazy.

Research: John Krerowicz has completed four years of bluebird box monitoring. While bluebird fledging was down, tree swallow and wren fledging were up from last year. Happily, orchid counts were also up. Sadly, the buckthorn eating moth caterpillar did not migrate this year, probably due to the cool early summer. Rob Sulski and friends banded 110 raptors including merlins, peregrines, harriers and four species of hawks. Nathan Robertson conducted field research on the effectiveness of different treatments for hawkweed and buckthorn. Kay McClelland led Heritage Plant monitoring of several species.

Education & Outreach: We spread the word with information tables at Spring into Gardening, Gateway Earth Day, and Snap-on Green Works, a presentation at the Pleasant Prairie Historical Society, and a well attended all day Prairie Neighbor Information event at the Chiwaukee Cottage. Kay McClelland led near weekly plant info walks and plans more in 2016. The Wolves and Bears Cub Scouts from Prairie Lane School plan a return visit in spring.

So in the year to come, with the incredible support of the Friends of the Prairie, we pledge to continue this volunteer effort to acquire and preserve the Chiwaukee Prairie State Natural Area, a key part of the "**Wetlands of International Importance**".
