Dear Friends,

The times are always changing. From the beginning of efforts to save Chiwaukee Prairie in 1965 to the present, a series of threats and challenges have been met by an ever-evolving assembly of citizen volunteers, their organizations, and the public support they inspired. Likewise, over the years this ecological jewel has received numerous designations and awards acknowledging its value and those who work to preserve it. For all those who have come before us, we continue their efforts with *our mission to acquire, restore, manage, and preserve Chiwaukee Prairie and support research and environmental education.*

Land Acquisition For many years, volunteers raised money for The Nature Conservancy (TNC) to buy lots in Chiwaukee south of 116th Street. The area had been platted in the 1920s and again in the 1940s for a total of over 600 lots. After incorporation in 1985, we continued helping TNC buy lots. Then in 2015, they gave their holdings to the Department of Natural Resources. DNR was unable to buy at that time, so CPPF began buying land from ready sellers. To date we have acquired 30 parcels, three in the past year. For the most part, the remaining privately held vacant lots were purchased long ago and have been passed down to younger generations who, for a variety of reasons, continue to pay taxes on mostly unbuildable land. In the coming year, we will continue to contact all of the owners of the remaining vacant lots. Also in the coming year, our Land Chair, Ingrid, will begin mentoring the next Land Chair to carry on land acquisition, step one in preservation.

Restoration & Management

The incursion of invasive species has made restoration and management key parts of our mission. This year our volunteers are on track to again exceed 2,500 hours of stewardship work. This is accomplished on monthly workdays, many extra workdays pulling and bagging flowering invasives, and independent volunteer work treating an everchanging pallet of exotic forbs, grasses, and brush resprouts. Rick, our wonderful volunteer coordinator, oversees scouting, planning, preparation, supplies, and equipment maintenance for workdays, leads the workdays and then provides cookies for all the volunteers, whose ages range from 20's to 80's !

CPPF also coordinates with the DNR staff, sharing plans and accomplishments. This Fall we helped mow firebreaks and DNR burned large areas south of 116th Street. More prescribed burns by contractors are planned for the Spring in north Units. While we currently do a lot, we need to do more in the battle with invasives. We especially need more volunteers to help with foliar treatment of buckthorn resprouts and forbs in the growing season. Flexible schedule! If interested, please see ways to contact us on page 2.

Science & Research The Heritage Plant Monitoring group had a rewarding year monitoring 8 different species of rare plants in 21 separate surveyed populations. New volunteers are always welcome. If you would like to know more about helping do plant surveys, please see ways to contact us on page 2.

Education & Outreach CPPF Board members have shared the human and cultural history of Chiwaukee Prairie with hundreds of community members this year. Continuing to build on interest from last year's photo exhibit at the Kenosha Public Museum, Dana gave five presentations speaking about birds, insects, plants, natural history, and conservation efforts in Chiwaukee Prairie. Pam presented the Preservation Story to the Fall meeting of the Milwaukee District Garden Clubs. Kay continued her monthly plant walks and hosted several specially arranged walks to share the common and unique species of plants as well as some of the cultural heritage of food and herbal remedies. In Spring, Kay will begin hosting monthly events through the Kenosha Public Library and start her first Saturday prairie walks in May.

Over the decades many things have changed. The Prairie has grown, many threats were confronted, recognition of how special it is has gone from local to international, and CPPF has taken on expanded roles. Many of you reading this have supported our efforts for decades. To you and to our newer Friends, we are deeply grateful for all your help and support.

Chiwaukee Prairie

NATIONAL NATURAL LANDMARK







The designation of Chiwaukee Prairie as a National Natural Landmark came just six years after its designation as a State Scientific Area in 1967. These early titles spoke to the ecological value of the area. Supporters of Chiwaukee had already defended it against a \$20M marina development by convincing TNC to start buying land in the Prairie. Recognition of Chiwaukee as a special conservation area helped convince some private owners to sell and volunteers to continue raising funds.

Over the ensuing years, marina development again, sewer extensions, regional planning for the Carol Beach area, a gravel pit proposal, and other issues brought together a coalition of eight environmental and nature organizations. They wanted Chiwaukee Prairie to be placed on a list of Damaged and Threatened National Natural Landmarks, hoping to get better protection. Among the leaders of this effort were Joan Rohan of the Hoy Nature Club and Donna Peterson of the Racine-Kenosha Sierra Club. They and several other first-generation defenders of Chiwaukee are in the photo to the left. Donna and Joan wisely saw the threats to the Prairie would not end soon and believed there needed to be an organization dedicated only to Chiwaukee Prairie. The next year, 1985, they incorporated the Chiwaukee Prairie Preservation Fund.

Now the Chiwaukee Prairie State Natural Area extends from the Kenosha city limits to the state line. It is part of the Chiwaukee Prairie-Illinois Beach Lake Plain that stretches to Waukegan. In 2015 the Lake Plain was designated a Wetland of International Importance. In January, the Lake Plain Partners will receive the George B. Rabb Force of Nature Award for their restoration work in the Lake Plain since 2008.

Over the decades the value of Chiwaukee Prairie has been reflected in numerous designations. At the same time, the threats and challenges shifted from development to battling invasives.
